INSTRUCTIONS: All flowers and plants entered for competition must have been grown by the exhibitor except in arrangement classes where purchased flowers and material are permitted. ENTRY TAGS MUST BE TIED (NOT TAPED) TO EXHIBIT. NO SILK FLOWERS OR ARTIFICIAL MATERIAL ALLOWED UNLESS REQUESTED. PLEASE REMOVE DAMAGED, DISCOLOURED, AND DEAD MATERIALS. ALSO READ PRIZE LIST CAREFULLY AND BE SURE THAT YOUR EXHIBIT IS ENTERED IN THE CORRECT SECTION. ALL ARRANGEMENTS MUST BE ASSEMBLED BEFORE ARRIVAL AT THE EXHIBITS HALL. Judge's Hint: for most arrangements best effect is obtained when the container height is 1/3 of the total height of the arrangement.

Should there be more than (6) six entries in any section and on the advice of the judge, a 4th prize of \$2 will be given. For changes in entries please contact the Secretary. Each exhibitor shall present his or her member's ticket when picking up exhibits for the hall at the conclusion of the fair. 6. Snapdragons, 3 spikes
7. Rose, 1 bloom, any colour. (Bloom: individual flower, one to a stem, do not leave buds showing)
8. Pansies, 3 stems
9. Marigolds, 3 blooms, of one variety

Only One Entry Per Person Per Section. Entries must be in place in exhibit hall by 10:00 am Friday of Fair and may not be moved until 4:45 pm Monday of Fair. EACH ENTRY MUST BE THE WORK OF THE EXHIBITOR, MUST BE CLEAN AND WILL ONLY BE ACCEPTED 2 YEARS. NOTE: PREFERENCE WILL BE GIVEN TO NEW WORK. Any change on entry card must be made through the Committee Head only. NOTE: Combined sewing machine and serging techniques will be accepted on garments unless otherwise specified. Should there be more than 6 entries in any section and on the advice of the judge, a 4th prize will be given.

All entry tags must be fastened securely to the garment ONLY with safety pins. Before removing entries from the hall, exhibitors must present their membership ticket and exhibitor number.

EACH ENTRY MUST BE THE WORK OF THE EXHIBITOR, MUST BE CLEAN AND WILL ONLY BE ACCEPTED 2 YEARS. **NOTE:** PREFERENCE WILL BE GIVEN TO NEW WORK. Any change on entry card must be made through the Committee Head only.

INSTRUCTIONS: PLEASE READ HOMECRAFT AND QUILTING RULES CAREFULLY

All entries in Class 38 must be in the Exhibit Hall by 10:00 am Friday of the Fair and may not be removed until 4:45 pm Monday of the Fair.

No person shall be permitted to enter more than one article per section in each class.

Each entry must be the work of the exhibitor, must be clean, and may be shown only two years. Preference will be given to new work. Soiled and damaged articles will not be accepted.

Should there be more than six (6) entries in any section, on the advice of the judge, a 4th prize will be given. At the discretion of the judge, with the approval of the Committee Head, a given

class may be subdivided to make judging and competition as appropriate as possible. Entry tags must be fastened securely with safety pins. Exhibitors are required to present their current exhibitor ticket and number, with a list of entries, to a director before removing entries.

ALL ENTRIES IN CLASS 38 MUST HAVE FABRIC SAMPLES ATTACHED AND MUST MEET THE SIZE REQUIREMENTS AS STIPULATED FOR EACH SECTION. FAILURE TO HAVE FABRIC SAMPLES ATTACHED AND FAILURE TO MEET THE SIZE REQUIREMENTS WILL RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION. ALL LABELS MUST BE COVERED.

OAAS ANNUAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUILT COMPETITION

A COMPLETE SET OF ELIGIBILITY, RULES AND REGULATIONS IS AVAILABLE

The two championship quilts (hand quilted and machine quilted) are eligible to compete at the OAAS District meeting in November 2017. The winners at District proceed to competition at the OAAS Convention in Toronto in February 2018. If an exhibitor does not wish his or her quilt to compete, please state on the back of the entry tag. If the championship winner does not want the champion quilt to proceed, the reserve champion quilt will proceed to the OAAS Quilt Competition. Upon making an entry into the OAAS Quilt Competition, the exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition. Prizes will be awarded at the District and Provincial Levels.

HAND QUILTED CHAMPIONSHIP: RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Entries must be solely made and hand quilted by the exhibitor.
- Entry quilts must be a minimum of 324" (823 cm) measured on the perimeter
- The Grand Prize winner of the Hand Quilted Championship Quilt will receive an award of \$500 at the Convention in February 2018.

- Article must have visible machine quilting.
- The Grand Prize winner of the Champion Machine Quilt will receive an award of \$500 at the Convention in February 2018.
